The Annual ESAO Wichtig Award of 2500 Euro is the most prominent award of the ESAO. It is aimed at encouraging young scientists (younger than 38 years) working in the field of artificial organ research. This award is based on the best peer-reviewed publication which will be briefly presented following the Award ceremony that will take place during the closing session. A call for submission will be available on the ESAO web-site and in the International Journal for Artificial Organs. The ESAO would like to thank Wichtig Editore for sponsoring this award.

ESAO POSTER AWARDS

Three Poster Awards (500, 300 and 200 Euro) will be given to the authors of the best posters, based on scientific content and presentation, selected by a special committee. Awards will be presented during the Congress Dinner (Friday, 5 September 2008).

ESAO INNOVATION AWARD

An Award of 500 Euro will be dedicated to the most innovative abstract presented. The selection will be made by a jury, based on abstract content and presentation. The award will be presented during the Congress Dinner (Friday, 5 September 2008).

RULES

Failure to observe these guidelines may result in disqualification.

- 1. Go to www.esao2008.medecine.unige.ch on the Internet. Click on "ABSTRACTS" and follow instructions as given.
- 2. An abstract can be submitted to the ESAO 2008 Meeting if it has not been published previously and only presented at a national meeting.
- 3. The correct topic must be selected to ensure correct scoring. The content of the abstract must be topic related.
- 4. Abstracts must contain data and meet international ethical standards.
- 5. Abbreviations should be defined.
- 6. Trade names cannot be mentioned in the title. However, trade names in brackets will be accepted in the body of the text.
- 7. An abstract cannot be accepted if the conflict of interest disclosure has not been ticked on the submission form. If the research or one of the co-authors has a conflict of interest, this must be clearly stated (Industry support / Shareholder, etc.).
- 8. The abstract cannot contain more than 2300 characters (blank spaces, punctuation as well as authors' affiliation and titles included).
- 9. The abstract must be structured into the following sections:
 - a. Objectives
 - b. Methods
 - c. Results
 - d. Conclusions
- 10. One table can be included, but the total number of cells (columns+rows) may not exceed 12. Please note that tables may significantly reduce the number of available characters.
- 11. If you have successfully submitted your abstract, you will receive a confirmation number. If no confirmation number is received, the abstract cannot be considered as successfully submitted and accepted by the system.



- 12 Submitted abstracts can be re-edited and modified until the submission deadline (01 April 2008, Midnight CET). Therefore, the author submitting the abstract will be required to provide his/her e-mail address as the login and a preferred password during the submission. To save the abstract, all required fields (marked with a red *) must be filled in. If you leave the system without having provisionally submitted the abstract, all data is lost. The submitted abstracts cannot be edited after the submission deadline (01 April 2008, Midnight CET).
- 13. Please ensure that your abstract does not contain spelling, grammatical or scientific errors. No corrections are possible after the submission deadline. The abstract will be **reproduced exactly as submitted**. No proofreading will be done.
- 14. If you need to withdraw your abstract, a written statement reflecting the reasons for this decision must be sent to: ESAO2008@mci-group.com, no later than 31 April 2008.
- 15. A number of awards will be given for the best abstracts presented as oral or poster presentations. Please refer to page 7.

AFTER THE SUBMISSION

- The reviewers will judge the abstracts according to the relevance of the topic of the ESAO 2008 meeting, standard of English, objectivity of statements, description of what was done, suitability of methods to aims, conclusions confirmed by objective results, ethics, scientific value, potential clinical value, originality of work and overall impression.
- 2. The submitting authors will be notified by **15 May 2008**, at the email address provided during submission, whether their abstract has been accepted. It is the author's responsibility to ensure that emails from ESAO can reach them. They will be informed at the same time about the date, time and form of their presentation.

PUBLICATION POLICY

All abstracts accepted for presentation (oral or poster) will be published in a regular issue of the International Journal of Artificial Organs, official journal of the ESAO. Authors (lectures, Symposia, Free Communications and Posters) are encouraged to submit the complete manuscript of their presentation to the International Journal of Artificial Organs. A publication desk from Wichtig Editore will be located in the exhibition area.

PRESENTATION OF ABSTRACTS

- 1. Abstracts can be accepted either as poster, or oral communication.
- 2. If your abstract is accepted as a poster, you will be requested to be available for discussion during the corresponding moderated poster viewing session.



- 3. Details on poster format will follow with the acceptation letter. Pins and adhesive material will be provided.
- 4. Please use letters large enough to be read from a distance of 1.5 meters (4.9 feet).
- 5. Oral presentations will be allocated 10 minutes each plus 5 minutes discussion time. Facilities to convert slides to data will be available at the Congress, if required. PowerPoint data projection with single screens will be available in all session rooms. A slide centre will be available and each presenter is required to hand in his presentation minimum 2 hours before his session. No personal computers will be allowed. Files must be prepared on Powerpoint 2000/2003 format on a CD-Rom or USB stick.
- 6. Full presentation guidelines will be included in the acceptance letter and posted on the congress website



ABOUT GENEVA



The World Meteorological Organization is an intergovernmental organization with a membership of 187 Member States and Territories. It originated from the International Meteorological Organization (IMO), which was founded in 1873. Established in 1950, WMO became the specialized agency of the United Nations for meteorology (weather and climate), operational hydrology and related geophysical sciences. Since its establishment, WMO has played a unique and powerful role in contributing to the welfare of humanity. Under WMO leadership and within the framework of WMO programs, National Meteorological and Hydrological Services have contributed substantially to the protection of life and property against natural disasters, to safeguarding the environment and to enhancing the economic and social well-being of all sectors of society in areas such as food security, water resources and transport. It has a unique role within the UN system it facilitates the free and unrestricted exchange of data and information, products and services in real- or near-real time on matters relating to safety and security of society, economic well being and the prevention of the environment. As weather and climate know no national boundaries, international cooperation at a global scale is essential for the development of meteorology and operational hydrology as well



as to reap the benefits from their applications. WMO provides the framework for such international cooperation

Nobody should leave Geneva without seeing its monuments and historical sites. We will take you to the most important ones in three hours, including the symbol of the city, the famous "water jet"; this impressive 460ft (140m) high lake water fountain, the first of its kind, was completed in 1891.

The flower clock in the English garden is another symbol of Geneva, known all over the world. The monument of Duke of

Brunswick, who left his entire fortune to the City of Geneva, is located right on the opposite side of Lake Geneva.

The historical Old Town will be visited on foot to discover its carefully preserved charm. The Cathedral Saint-Pierre constructed in the 12th and 13th centuries dominates the Old Town. Right next to it is the Auditorium, where Jean Calvin taught. Calvin arrived in 1536 in Geneva.

Leading figure of the protestant Reformation, he deeply influenced religion, ethics and social life in the western world. The oldest privately constructed building is the Maison Tavel, now transformed into a museum of old Geneva.

With its parks and gardens, its monuments and museums, Geneva is today truly international and cosmopolitan, not only in population but also in its whole atmosphere.
